# PIONEER OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN INDONESIA

The passion to establish a higher education institution in Indonesia that would provide students' with outstanding academic background along with Islamic knowledge started even when the nation was born. In 1945, a general assembly meeting of the Masjoemi (Majelis Sjoero Moeslimin Indonesia ) was held. The meeting was attended by some of the leading political figures of the day including Dr. Mohammad Hatta (the first Vice President of Indonesia), Mohammad Natsir, Mohammad Roem, and Wachid Hasyim. One of the decisions of this meeting was the establishment of Sekolah Tinggi Islam (STI – Islamic Higher School) by those leading figures, who became the institution's founders.

Ull was founded in 8 July 1945 and became the pioneer of national higher education in Indonesia. Initially Ull had four faculties: Religion, Law, Education, and Economics. Ull was forced to close due to the Dutch military invasion in 1947. Many students and staff members joined the Indonesian military force to repel the Dutch invasion. In the early 1950s, shortly after the war, Ull had to move its classes from place to place around the city of Yogyakarta, even using part of the Sultan's Palace and some of the faculty members' houses as classrooms.

Ull had undergone improvements between 1961-1970 under the leadership of Prof. Mr. R.H.A. Kasmat Bahuwintang (1960-1963) and Prof. Dr. dr. Sardjito (1964-1970). During his term in office, Ull develop Faculty of Islamic Studies and Faculty of Tarbiyah as well as expanding to Purwokerto to establish The Faculty of Law and Shari'a.

From 1964 to 1970, under the leadership of Prof. Dr. dr. Sardjito (a leading medical doctor in Indonesia), Ull expanded to 22 faculties, five located in Yogyakarta and the rest were scattered in four provinces: Central Java (Solo, Klaten, and Purwokerto); East Java (Madiun); West and North Sulawesi (Gorontalo). The areas of study offered were Economics, Law, Islamic Law (Syari'ah), Islamic Education (Tarbiyah), Engineering, Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, and Pharmacy. However, when government regulations prevented Ull from maintaining educational activities outside Yogyakarta, Ull had to close its branch campuses. Some of them became associated with local institutions.

In the early 1970s to 1982, Ull saw extensive physical development of its offices and faculty buildings, followed by the construction of three other campuses located throughout the city. Since 1990, Ull has located its new main campus at Kaliurang km 14.5 Yogyakarta. Built on 35-hectare of land, our campus standing on a hillside become the largest and the most stunning in the north side of Yogyakarta.

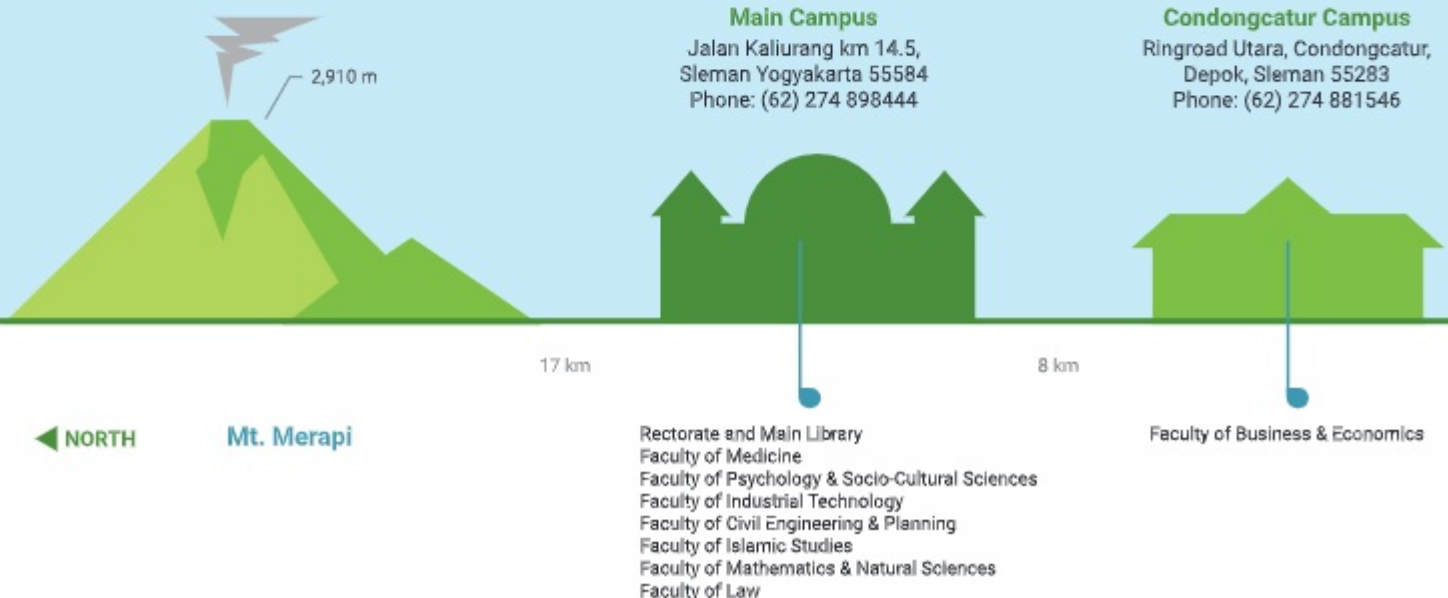


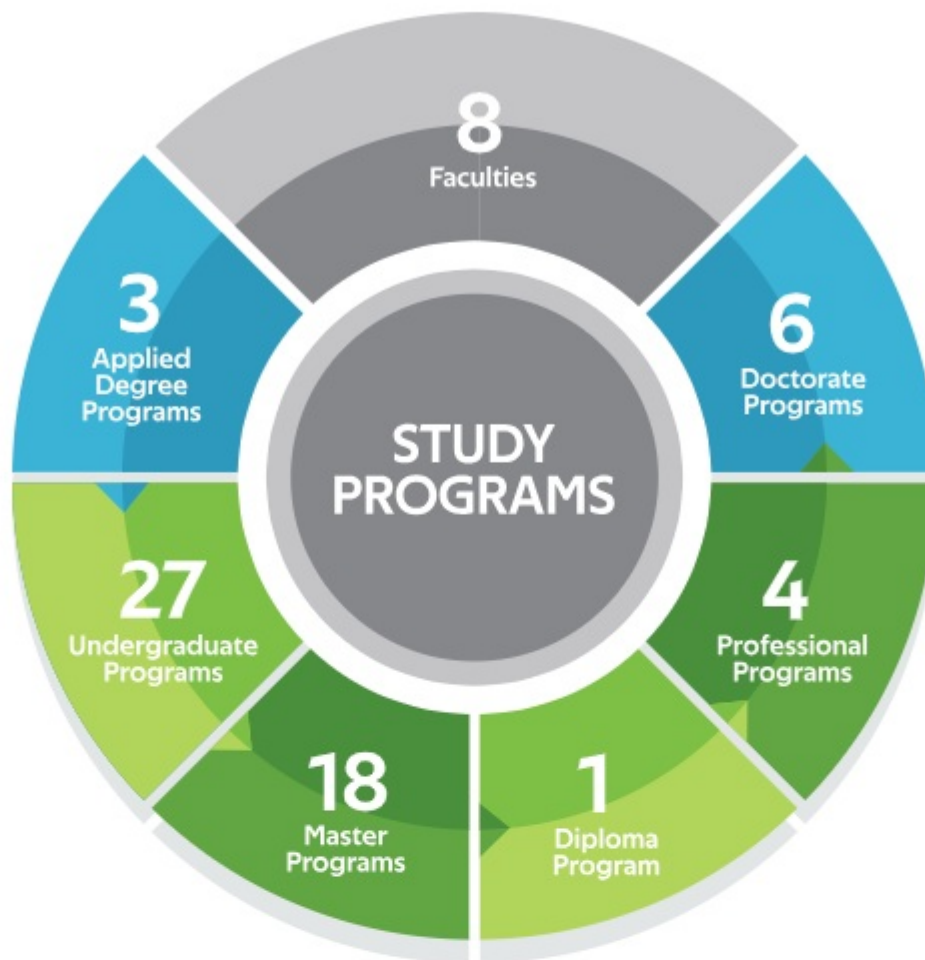

The city also provides various facilities to support the learning needs of students such as the city library, bookstores, internet cafes, copy centers and stationeries. To enjoy a relaxing time on the weekend, you can visit the shopping center, cinemas, and a variety of entertainment and fun hangout places. Wherever you come from, you will find and feel Yogyakarta as your second home.

## Accommodations

Home of over one hundred higher educational institutions, with student coming from all over the country and abroad, Yogyakarta is a great "campus" for multi disciplinary scientific discourses and cross-cultural interactions. Such a dominant presence of students influences the cost of living in Yogyakarta, which is relatively inexpensive compare to the living cost in other major cities in Indonesia.

We understand that proper accommodation plays an important role in supporting the comfort of living and academic success for our students. A wide choice of boarding or rented house with variety of rental rates and facilities can be found easily around campus Ull. Affordable accommodation is another reason why people choose this city for studying and living.

### On-Campus Accommodation

Accommodation facilities owned by Ull currently provided for students receiving scholarships from Pondok Pesantren Ull and used interchangeably for religious training activities (PNDI and LKID). These campus accommodation are located in two locations as follows:

**Pondok Pesantren Ull Putra (Male Students Boarding School)**, located in Jl. Selokan Mataram, Condongcatur, Depok, Sleman, Yogyakarta. This campus dormitory has 33 rooms which accommodate 66 students. The location of this dormitory is close to the downtown, with a range of 2 km distance to Campus Condongcatur (Faculty of Economics), approximately 9 km to Taman Siswa Campus (Faculty of Law), and approximately 14 km to the Main Campus.

**Pondok Pesantren Ull Putri (Female Students Boarding School)**, located in Ull Main Campus, this student dormitory provides 24 rooms with a capacity of 60 students.

**Ull Student Dormitory**, located in Ull Main Campus and currently used as a temporary boarding facility for conducting Pesantrenisasi for new students, and other religious training activities. Ull student dormitory has a total of 48 rooms with the capacity approximately 300 people.



### Off-Campus Accommodation

There are many accommodation facilities are available around Ull campus. Students can choose to rent a room (kost), or rented house with several rooms that can be shared with a few friends. Off-campus accommodation fees are vary depending on location and amenities provided.

To get more information about off-campus accommodations, students can visit and see directly the various facilities available.

### Support Facilities

In addition to convenient access from other major cities through Adisutjipto International Airport, Tugu and Lempuyangan Train Stations, as well as Giwangan and Jombor Bus Stations, Yogyakarta also has reliable city transportation. Students can easily access the city bus transportation (Trans Jogja), using motorcycle taxi (ojek) or calling for a cab. However, private motorcycles and cars are the most widely used by students.

### Cullinary

Various kinds of amenities at affordable prices can be found easily throughout Yogyakarta at stalls, mini markets, malls or even the local traditional markets. Food can also be found without difficulty at street food stalls, cafes, and

restaurants. Asides from providing Yogyakarta traditional cuisine, various traditional dishes from all over Indonesia and international cuisine are also available.

### Academic and Recreation

Various support facilities such as telecommunications, libraries, book stores, photocopy centers, computer stores, and electronic peripheral stores are available in Yogyakarta. Postal delivery and international fund transfer will not be a problem as post offices and banks can be found in every subdistrict.

To escape from routine academic activities, Yogyakarta offers many recreational options, shopping destination, and beautiful temples and beaches to visit.

# BECOMING GLOBAL CITIZENS

## Indonesian Heritage Story (IHS)

Indonesia has been known for its unity in diversity. This unique legacy is being nurtured by its society, having a lot of diversity of culture, beliefs, traditions, languages, arts, and typical buildings. The rich of culture of Indonesia inspired Universitas Islam Indonesia (UII) to develop a short program with the topic "Indonesian Heritage Story (IHS)" that provided opportunities for the participants to learn and experience in-class and outdoor activities regarding the topic. The IHS 2022 was held on 2-5 August 2022 participated by 20 students from five partner universities i.e. Universiti Malaya, Universiti Kuala Lumpur MESTECH, FPT University, University of Economics and Law, Vietnam National University Ho Chi Minh City, and Pangasinan State University.



## The Tales of Indonesian Coffee and Tea (TALENT)

The Tales of Indonesian Coffee and Tea (TALENT) was conducted on 8-11 August 2023 with the objectives to provide the participants with the knowledge of coffee and tea and how it affects the human body, the historical importance of Indonesian coffee and tea, the experiences of the food processing techniques in today's manufacturing, and the benefits of caffeine and educate about its impacts on daily life. By the end of the program, the participants presented their sustainable program ideas for preserving coffee and tea in their home country. The program was attended by 25 students from partner universities: Universiti Malaya, Rangsit University, and Hanoi University of Mining and Geology



## Food Exploration and Sustainable Tradition (FEAST)

Exploring Indonesian food heritage offered various approaches to engage with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 2: Zero Hunger and SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production. By exploring Indonesia's rich culinary traditions, participants could gain insights into sustainable food practices, the importance of preserving cultural heritage, and the role of food in fostering community resilience and sustainability. This program participated by 19 students from partner universities: Universiti Malaya, FPT University Da Nang, FPT University Ho Chi Minh City, World City College Philippines, University of Economics and Law, Vietnam National University Ho Chi Minh City, Universiti Putra Malaysia, and Universiti Kuala Lumpur MESTECH.



## Global Tailored Program

### Global & Local Engagement between Singapore and Indonesia (Global SEA) with Temasek Polytechnic (TP), Singapore

Universitas Islam Indonesia (UII) and Temasek Polytechnic (TP), Singapore, held a collaborative program entitled Global & Local Engagement between Singapore and Indonesia (Global SEA) on 6-10 November 2023. This program aimed to provide 48 TP students with experiences related to the Indonesian language and culture, laboratory activities on essential oils and aromatherapy, and excursion programs by visiting some historical sites in the Yogyakarta area. Below is the testimony of one of TP's students about the Global SEA Program.

### Indonesian Culture & Society (ICS) with Universiti Kuala Lumpur Institute of Medical Science and Technology (UniKL MESTECH)

The Indonesian Culture & Society (ICS) was held on 2-15 October 2023, designed especially for 12 students from UniKL MESTECH. ICS aimed to learn about different cultures and social interactions with the local community, exchange ideas, create bonding, and increase global networking. ICS, worth four credits hours, offered activities consisting of art and cultural classes, field trips, and community service programs. At the end of the program, the participants presented their cultural experiences. They also shared ideas to develop the potential in Sendangsari Village – one of the Yogyakarta villages where they spent two-day visits and observations.

The duration of the tailored mobility program can be customized. Our default program schedule and duration will be around 2 (two) weeks, including flights (arrival and departure).

### Thematic Lectures

Topics of lectures offered to international students can be related to Islamic knowledge, Indonesian language and culture programs, and global issues designed to suit the focus of the program topic and objectives.

### Field Trips

In a tailored mobility program, diverse activities, such as visiting historical and touristic places, are included to enrich the program's learning experiences.

### Short Internships

The internship can be one of the optional activities in the tailored mobility program held in several local institutions partnered with UII. The duration of the program can be matched with the program design, and it can be designed as a credited program.

### ACICIS (Australian Consortium For-In Country Indonesian Study)

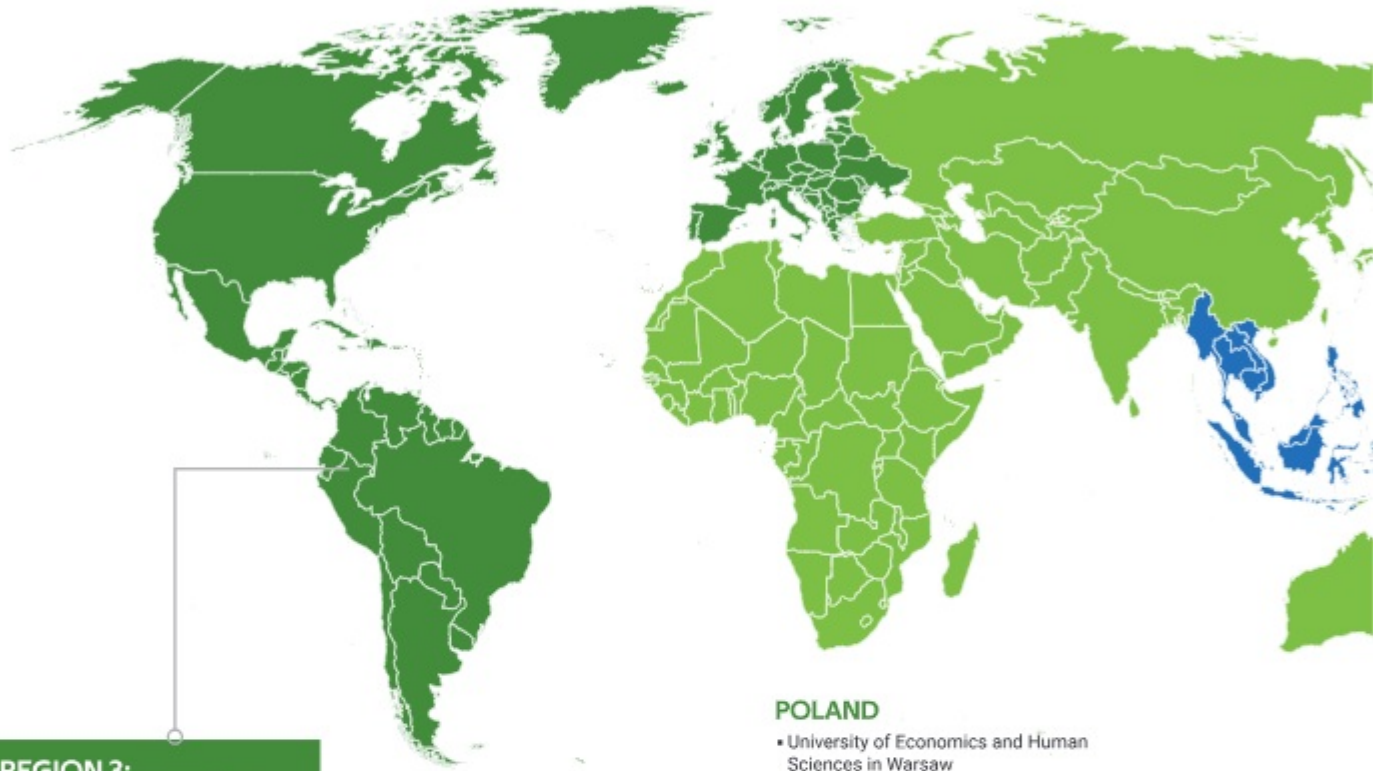
